

Zambian Mixed Martial Arts athlete and reigning IMMAF Africa middleweight champion Gilbert Ndlovu has sent a strong warning to his challengers ahead of the 2025 African championships to be held in Luanda, Angola.

The 2025 edition will be held from May 4 to 10 and will feature youth, junior, senior, and masters divisions. The event aims to build upon the success of previous IMMAF events, like the 2024 World Championships, where African athletes made history.

The event aims to provide a platform for the continent's top amateur talent and highlight the growth of African Mixed Martial Arts (MMA).

This year's event introduces two new divisions to the African stage for the first time. Youth D (10-11) athletes will have the opportunity to test their skills at the highest level, while the highly anticipated Masters divisions make their highly anticipated IMMAF debut.

In a video posted on the International Mixed Martial Arts Federation (IMMAF), Ndlovu says he is aiming to win another gold medal at the African championships. Ndhlovu has revealed that he will this year compete in the super welterweight category.

"I'm the reigning African champion at middleweight at the IMMAF African Championship. I'm looking to come and get gold again, but this time around in the super

welterweight," Ndlovu said.

"Guys in my division, watch out; I'm coming for gold, and this is reality. I'm coming to smash everybody."

IMMAF President Kerrith Brown says Africa continues to be a driving force for IMMAF in the global mixed martial arts landscape.

"Africa continues to be a driving force for IMMAF in the global MMA landscape, showcasing grassroots talent with spirit, dedication, resilience, sportsmanship, enabling all to test their skills, gain international recognition, and take the next steps in their athletic development," Brown said.

Windhoek, Namibia — South Africa, Namibia, Zimbabwe, and Egypt have secured qualification for the 2025 FIH Junior Hockey World Cups following strong performances at the 2024 Junior Africa Cup, held from April 18 to 25 in Windhoek.

In the women's competition, South Africa dominated the pool stage, winning all five matches and finishing with a goal difference of +38. Namibia finished second, with their only loss coming against the eventual champions. Both teams sealed early qualification for the FIH Hockey Women's Junior World Cup in Chile. Zimbabwe claimed the final African spot by defeating Uganda 6-1 in the bronze medal match. South Africa completed their flawless campaign with a 5-0 victory over Namibia in the final.

The men's tournament saw South Africa continue their dominance, winning all five matches, including a 5-0 win over Namibia in the final. Both sides booked their places at the FIH Hockey Men's Junior World Cup in India. Egypt secured Africa's final qualification slot after defeating

Kenya in a shootout, following a dramatic draw in their bronze medal match.

FIH President Tayyab Ikram praised the qualifying teams, noting that the expanded format of 24 teams at the upcoming World Cups is part of the FIH Empowerment and Engagement strategy aimed at growing the game globally.

Meanwhile, the Zambia men's and women's teams are back in the country.

Zambia Hockey Association (ZHA) has thanked the sponsors for their support to the teams.

"Zambia hockey wish to thank to all the sponsors, stakeholders, partners, hockey community, fans, athletes and media. Please continue to support us for the development of our sport in the country. Without you we wouldn't have been here," ZHA posted on their official Facebook page.

With the conclusion of the Junior Africa Cup, the qualification process for both the men's and women's 2025 Junior World Cups is now complete.

Lusaka – Eden University, in collaboration with its Polish-based partner institution, WSG University, has taken a significant step towards advancing sports science education in Zambia.

A delegation led by Eden University Vice Chancellor, Dr. Alvert Ng'andu, with senior management staff and a two-member team from WSG, held a courtesy meeting with the National Sports Council of Zambia (NSCZ) on Friday.

The meeting, held at the NSCZ headquarters, aimed to assess the current integration of sports science within the Zambian sports landscape explore avenues for strengthening athlete performance through academic programs in sports science and sports

management.

Speaking during the meeting, Dr. Ng'andu emphasized Eden commitment University's to supporting national efforts in enhancing sports performance. He highlighted the importance of structured training in sports dynamics, noting that academic backing in sports science would play a vital role in producing world-class athletes.

"As a university, we are committed to ensuring that athletes and sports administrators are equipped with the necessary scientific knowledge to consistently achieve excellence," said Dr. Ng'andu.

"We are optimistic that through a well-structured Memorandum of Understanding, we will open new

doors for the National Sports Council and the sports fraternity at large," he added.

NSCZ CEO, Sombwa Musunsa welcomed the delegation and expressed gratitude to Eden University and WSG for considering a partnership. He reiterated that the council's mandate aligns perfectly

with the proposal, as it aspires to elevate the standard of sports performance in Zambia through a scientific approach.

"Our vision has always been to produce athletes who can consistently mint medals on both continental and global stages," Musunsa said.

"Integrating sports science into athlete development is not just timely but essential," he added.

Leading the WSG team, Professor Skaily presented several success stories from countries such as Kazakhstan, Poland, Germany, and parts of Africa, where the introduction of sports science programs had significantly boosted athletic performance at national and continental competitions.

He outlined potential areas where NSCZ and its affiliates could benefit, including athlete management, injury nutrition, prevention, and psychological conditioning.

ARTETA FACES CHAMPIONS LEAGUE SHOWDOWN WITH MENTOR LUIS ENRIQUE

Arsenal manager Mikel Arteta will face a key figure from his footballing past when the Gunners meet Luis Enrique's Paris Saint-Germain in the Champions League semifinals on Tuesday. Arteta, who was mentored by Enrique during his early playing days at Barcelona, credits the Spaniard with helping shape his coaching philosophy and called him "one of the best coaches in the world."

While Arteta's Arsenal beat PSG 2-0 in the group stage, the French champions have grown stronger since, with Enrique's tough decisions — such as benching Ousmane Dembele for disciplinary reasons — paying off handsomely. Despite the deep mutual respect between the two managers, both are determined to deliver long-awaited European success to their clubs. Arsenal have never won the Champions League,

falling short in the 2006 final, while PSG were beaten finalists in 2020.

Arteta's side arrives with momentum after a dominant quarterfinal win over holders Real Madrid but have stumbled in the Premier League, partly due to injuries. Key players like Kai Havertz and Gabriel Jesus remain sidelined, and midfielder Thomas Partey is suspended for the first leg. Leandro Trossard, likely to lead the attack, has called on the fans to recreate the "electric atmosphere" that helped dismantle Madrid at the Emirates.

Meanwhile, PSG, who have already eliminated Liverpool and Aston Villa, are aiming for a third English scalp as they chase their first-ever Champions League crown. For both managers, friendship will take a back seat to glory in a tie that could define their careers.
