BARBRA BANDA NAMED TO NWSL BEST XI FOR | FASHION SAKALA SHINES **APRIL AFTER STANDOUT PERFORMANCES**

Zambian star shines in U.S. top flight as Orlando Pride push for back-toback titles.

Orlando Pride forward and Zambia national team captain Barbra Banda has been named to the NWSL Best XI of the Month for April, presented by Amazon Prime, after an outstanding run of form in the American top-tier women's league.

Banda netted two goals and registered 11 shots across three appearances during April, helping the Pride stay on course in their quest for a second consecutive NWSL Shield. Her explosive speed, physicality, and finishing instinct have made her a nightmare for defenders and a

driving force behind Orlando's González (Gotham FC), attacking success.

"Barbra Banda continues to prove why she's one of the best strikers in the world," said an NWSL analyst. "She brings energy, precision, and star power to every match she plays."

This recognition adds to Banda's growing list of accolades since arriving in the U.S. and highlights her rapid adaptation to the league's pace and physicality. It also brings international attention to Zambia's emerging influence in global women's football.

Banda joins a list of elite performers in the April Best XI, including Esther

who claimed the Player of the Month title after scoring seven goals, and Aubrey Kingsbury (Washington Spirit), who led all goalkeepers with 13 saves and two clean sheets.

The NWSL Best XI of the Month is selected by the NWSL Media Association and the league's broadcast team, recognizing standout players based on regular season performances.

Barbra Banda's inclusion is more than personal recognition-it's a proud moment for Zambian fans and a sign of bigger things to come in her NWSL journey.





Zambian international Fashion Sakala played a decisive role in Al Feiha's 2-1 victory over Damac in the Saudi Pro League, registering a key assist that helped secure a vital three points for his side. The former Chipolopolo striker featured for the entire 90 minutes and was instrumental in the attacking third, recording a 78% pass completion rate and one key pass. His performance earned him a match rating of 6.7.

The win lifts Al Feiha to 33 points from 30 matches, with a season record of 9 wins, 12 draws, and 11 losses. While it's been a mixed campaign for the club, Sakala has consistently provided bright moments with his energy and creativity in the final third.

English Premier League side Brighton & Hove Albion and French Ligue 1 outfit LOSC Lille are reportedly keeping tabs on the Al Feiha star, viewing him as a strong addition to bolster their forward lines. Meanwhile, Al-Nasr, one of the Saudi Pro League's biggest clubs, is said to be keen on acquiring Sakala's services to enhance their attacking depth.

Having previously featured in Europe for Rangers and KV Oostende, a return to top-tier European football would mark another major chapter in Sakala's career. However, the allure of continuing in Saudi Arabia, possibly with a title-contending team like Al-Nasr, presents an equally tempting prospect.

The Zambian football fraternity has joined Copper Queens goalkeeper Hazel Nali and her family in mourning the passing of her father, Sergeant Evans Nali, who passed away on April 29, 2025, at the age of 51.

The late Sergeant Nali was laid to rest at Mutumbi Cemetery and Remembrance Park in Lusaka, following a solemn church service held at the Army Chapel, where he was accorded a three-volley salute in recognition of his service.

Born on June 28, 1973, Sergeant Nali is survived by his wife and children. His daughter, Hazel Nali, a celebrated figure in Zambian women's football, delivered a moving tribute to her father, highlighting his

unwavering support encouragement throughout her career, particularly during challenging times such as injury setbacks.

In her heartfelt eulogy, Hazel expressed profound gratitude for having him as her father.

"I am grateful to God for giving me a father like him. He was a father who loved his children very much, if God gave me another chance to choose a father, I would still choose you my big Nali," she said.

Drawing strength from her father's memory, Hazel made a resolute promise: "I promise to get back on the field again and make you and the nation proud, rest in peace my commando."

Her words underscored the profound impact her father had on her life and her determination to honor his legacy through her continued achievements in football.

The burial ceremony was attended by a wide array of mourners, including representatives from the Zambia Army, members of the Copper Queens national team, the Green Buffaloes Women Football Club led by their coach Charles Haalubono, members of the broader sporting community, and the general public, all gathered to pay their respects.


