ZAMBIA DRAWN IN TOUGH GROUP ALONGSIDE **MOROCCO AND DR CONGO FOR 2025 CHAN**

The official draws for the 2025 African Nations Championship (CHAN) have been concluded, setting the stage for an exciting tournament to be co-hosted by Kenya, Tanzania, and Uganda. The Copper Bullets of Zambia have been placed in a challenging Group A, alongside continental powerhouses Morocco and DR Congo, as well as hosts Kenya and Angola.

The draw, which took place on Tuesday, has created intriguing pathways for the participating nations in the tournament exclusively for players competing in their respective national leagues. Zambia's placement in Group A immediately stands out as one of the most competitive pools, promising highoctane clashes from the group stages. Group A Breakdown:

• Kenya (Hosts): Playing on home • Zambia: The Copper Bullets will

• Morocco: The two-time CHAN champions, Morocco, will enter the tournament as one of the teams to beat. Their consistent success in recent editions makes them a formidable opponent.

CHIPATA UNITED GIVEN SURVIVAL LIFELINE AS ZPL AWARDS CRUCIAL POINTS

Chipata United's hopes of remaining in the ZPL National League have received a significant boost following the latest verdicts issued by the league's governing body. The Eastern Province-based side has been awarded a total of 12 crucial points following successful appeals in two separate cases.

The Zambia Premier League (ZPL) ruled in favour of Chipata United in their appeals against both Jumulo and Leopards Hill. In both instances, the ZPL found that the opposing teams fielded ineligible players in their home and away fixtures against Chipata United during the season. As a result,

Chipata United have been awarded six points for each of these matches, providing a major injection to their survival bid. They have now moved to 35 points.

Meanwhile, in another league decision, Mpulungu Harbour have been awarded three points following the abandonment of their game against Kafue Eagles. The match was abandoned following crowd trouble marred by a heated exchange between the two sides.

These points adjustments have dramatically reshaped the relegation battle as the national league prepares for its final weekend of

action. Chipata United now find themselves in a tense fight for survival alongside Ndola United, Kafue Celtic, Kafue Eagles and Young Green Buffaloes. All the team need at least a win to stay up in the secondtier league.

The final matchday will also determine which three teams will gain promotion to the Super League, with Trident FC, River Plate, and Prison Leopards all vying for a coveted spot in the top flight of Zambian football.

The dramatic turn of events following the ZPL's verdicts has added significant intrigue to the league's conclusion.

According to the statement, "The Ministry has established direct contact with Mr. Kelvin Mubanga Kampamba, a professional Zambian footballer currently playing for Al Madina SC in the Libyan Premier League. Mr. Kampamba is safe and has expressed his willingness to return home in light of the deteriorating security situation."

Atletico Lusaka Football Club has provided an encouraging update on the condition of their central defender, Simon Chipanama, confirming the successful completion of surgery to repair a medial meniscus tear in his right knee. The injury, a significant setback for the player and the club, occurred at the onset of the 2024/2025 MTN Super League season.

Chipanama sustained the knee injury in October 2024 during a training session, a cruel blow that limited his appearances to just nine Super League matches. Since that unfortunate incident, the resilient

diligently defender has been undergoing physiotherapy under the guidance of Atletico Lusaka's medical team, spearheaded by Dr. Innocent Mulako, from October 2024 through May 2025.

In a crucial step towards his recovery, Chipanama underwent arthroscopy surgery on May 11th, 2025. Reflecting on this pivotal moment, the player, as quoted by the club's media, acknowledged the significance of the procedure for his career trajectory.

Looking back at the arduous journey, Chipanama described the

2024/2025 campaign as an exceptionally difficult and emotionally taxing period for him.

However, his spirit remains unbroken, and he conveyed a strong desire to return to competitive action. With characteristic optimism, Chipanama expressed his belief that the upcoming season holds greater promise for both himself and Atletico Lusaka.

The club has reported that Chipanama is showing positive signs in his initial recovery phase. He is now expected to embark on a further 2-3 months of dedicated physiotherapy and rehabilitation. This carefully structured program aims to ensure a thorough and complete recovery, allowing him to return to peak physical condition.

Despite the resounding win, head coach Carol Kanyemba offered a grounded assessment of her team's performance.

"We didn't play a good game. We made a lot of wrong decisions and were in a haste to get goals without proper ball movement, which really affected us," said Kanyemba. "We could have scored a lot more if only we passed the ball better and shot at the right time. Because of those mistakes, we missed a lot of chances."

The Copper Princesses raced to a 3-0 halftime lead through goals from Mazimba (20'), Banda (24'), and captain Mukoma (32'). Substitutes Esther Makoti and Mary Nyangu

Mauritius were reduced to ten players in the 52nd minute, and Zambia capitalized with a further flurry of goals, Banda completing her hat-trick (64', 76'), Mwape scoring twice (73', 80'), and Ngwabe adding the ninth in stoppage time.

Coach Kanyemba acknowledged the contributions of her defenders, who not only kept a clean sheet but also contributed on the score sheet.

"Our frontline was in too much of a hurry, but the defense made the right choices. We even scored from some set pieces, which shows the defenders played far better than the attack today."

Looking ahead to Friday's semifinal, Kanyemba emphasized the need for improved coordination and focus.

"The games will not be easier. We need to work on our team coordination and concentration. We give credit to the girls for what we've achieved so far, and we thank God for allowing us to come this far. Whether we face Botswana or Lesotho, we must be ready. If the players come to the party, we shall get the result we need."

The Copper Princesses will play their semifinal on Friday, May 16 at 12h00 CAT. In the other semifinal, Malawi will take on the best-placed runner-up. Zambia remains on course to defend their title as they chase back-to-back COSAFA U17 crowns.

Abafana Bes'thende, on the other hand, remained 14th in the standings, just three points above the relegation playoff spot.

Arrows will be desperate for a victory when they take on Richards Bay away on Saturday in the KwaZulu-Natal derby.

The Buccaneers attacked the Abafana Bes'thende's defence with speed from wide areas and they broke the deadlock in the 16th minute after some great work by Relebohile Mofokeng, whose pass found Tshegofatso Mabasa to make it 1-0 to Pirates.

It was nearly 2-0 to Pirates in the 19th minute when flying full-back Bandile Shandu hit the upright with a deflected shot.

However, Arrows did threaten in the 23rd minute when Nduduzo Sibiya hit the woodwork with a sublime curling effort and Pirates were leading 1-0 at halftime after containing Arrows.

A second half that was dominated by the Buccaneers followed as Deon

Pirates' 3-0 victory over Arrows was sealed by Kabelo Dlamini, who beat Watenga with a top-class free-kick which curled into the far post in the 66th minute, much to the delight of the Bucs fans inside the iconic stadium in what was coach Riveiro's farewell match.

In departing Orlando Pirates earlier than planned, after Tuesday's Betway Premiership clash at home to Lamontville Golden Arrows, Jose Riveiro will not equal Ruud Krol as the longest serving coach at the club.

But the 47-year-old Spaniard will finish with more games in charge than his Dutch counterpart, who was at Pirates for three full seasons from 2008 to 2011.

Riveiro departs the club after the match against Arrows, leaving assistant Mandla Ncikazi to complete the season with four league matches to take charge of.

Riveiro had asked Pirates chairman Irvin Khoza to be allowed to leave early to join his new club, without revealing the identity.

It has been widely reported, but not verified officially that Riveiro is headed to Egyptian giants Al Ahly and will get to coach in next month's Club World Cup.

Pirates thanked him on Tuesday as they sent out a tweet of appreciation for his time at the club, which saw Bucs win five knockout trophies but finish only as a runner-up to

Tuesday's clash at the Orlando Stadium against Arrows (live on SuperSport at 7:30pm) will be the 132nd of Riveiro's reign after arriving to replace the duo of Ncikazi and Fadlu Davids.

He won 79, drew 26 and lost 126 of his matches in charge, including last Saturday's Nedbank Cup final to archrivals Kaizer Chiefs.

This season alone, Pirates have played 47 matches already and will finish the season with a total of 52 because of their progress to the last four of the Champions League.

Krol spent three full seasons as Pirates coach, the first man to do so in the long history of the club, but his tally of games over the three seasons was 119.

He won 60 of them, drew 38 and lost 21.

The former Dutch World Cup captain took Pirates to the triple of the league, Nedbank Cup and MTN8 in his last season in 2011 but surprisingly did not have his contract renewed thereafter.

Mamelodi Sundowns will look to secure the Betway Premiership title for the eighth straight season when they face Chippa United, for the second time in a week, at the Buffalo City Municipality Stadium in East London on Wednesday.


